1.	Part 3 – COF	29 – Certification Plan	29 (3)(c & d)	All section c & d	These sections make reference to a handful of SCE requirements but is not all encompassing. Section 29(3)(b) suggests a list of SCE’s are required for each Certification Plan. This should be used to outline the requirements, as it is all encompassing for the particular installation. For example, section 29(3)(d)(ii) talks about FFE, however, nowhere in these sections does it discuss LSA/Drilling, etc.	Remove 29(c) & 29(d), then amend 29(e) as follows: “any measures that the operator intends to implement to reduce safety and environmental risks to a level that is as low as reasonably practicable in respect of the design of the installation, including its systems and equipment. This includes, but is not limited to, those measures to satisfy the purposes of subsections 98, 103(5), 103(6), 111(4), 111(5), 121(1), 127(8), 130(2), 131(1), 131(2), 132(1)(a), 134(1), 135(3), 141(4) and 141(2).”

(autorité)	Lloyd’s Register is referenced using it’s full registered corporate entity name, while the other three organizations are listed with their more generic, non-registered entity name, i.e. the name which they are most commonly referred.	Change text to “ certifying authority means the American Bureau of Shipping, Bureau Veritas, Det norske Veritas or Lloyd’s Register. (autorité)”
