Application Completion Guide

No.

1. Enter the applicant's name and address in Canada and, if the applicant is a corporation, enter, in brackets "()", the name of the individual submitting the application on its behalf. Please note that the applicant must be a resident of Canada.
2. Enter the name and address of the exporter, **only if** the applicant is not the exporter.
3. Indicate with a checkmark the address where you would like the Canadian certificate to be sent, i.e., either the address included in No. 1 (Applicant) or 2 (Exporter).
4. Enter the full name and address of the consignee, i.e., the name and address of the person or company to whom the exporter is exporting the rough diamonds.
5. Enter the name of the Kimberley Process participant (e.g., country) to which the rough diamonds are to be shipped.
6. If the shipment is an export of diamonds imported into Canada after January 1, 2003, enter the alpha-numeric number(s) of the Kimberley Process Certificates that have accompanied any imports relating to this shipment.
7. Enter the name of the country from where the rough diamonds were mined.
8. **COMPLETE ONLY IF THE DIAMONDS ORIGINATE AND WERE MINED IN CANADA**
Enter the province/territory of origin.
9. **COMPLETE ONLY IF THE DIAMONDS ORIGINATE AND WERE MINED IN CANADA**
Enter the name of the mine where the diamonds originated.
10. **COMPLETE ONLY IF THE DIAMONDS ORIGINATE IN CANADA FROM AN EXPLORATION SITE**
If the diamonds were recovered during exploration in Canada, enter the latitude and longitude of the exploration site in degrees and minutes.

11. **COMPLETE ONLY IF THE DIAMONDS WERE EXTRACTED FROM MINERAL CONCENTRATES**
If the diamonds were extracted from mineral concentrates within Canada, whether or not the mineral concentrate originated from Canada, enter the name and place of the facility where the diamonds were extracted.
12. Indicate with a "yes" or "no" if the diamonds being exported were present in Canada on January 1, 2003, and, if yes, provide documentary evidence establishing their presence in Canada at that time.
13. Enter the Customs Tariff subheading (i.e., Harmonized System [HS] number) applied to the diamond export. Exporters may show the export HS number or the Canadian import HS number. Please see below for a list of the subheadings, including descriptions.
14. Provide a complete description of the goods in normal trade terms with sufficient detail to verify the declared HS code.
15. Enter the total number of containers in the shipment.
16. Provide the number for a seal for each container within the shipment. These numbers will appear on the Canadian certificate.
17. Enter the total mass of the rough diamonds measured in carats.
18. Enter the total value of the rough diamonds in U.S. dollars. If you wish, include any explanatory notes on how the total value was assessed. These optional explanatory notes will be included on the Canadian certificate.
19. Print the name and telephone number (including area code) of the applicant (individual) attesting to the information supplied in this application.
20. The applicant (individual) attesting to the information supplied in this application must sign in the space provided.
21. Enter the date of completion of this application form.

Natural Diamonds - Diamonds, whether or not worked, but not mounted or set.
HS 7102.10 - Unsorted.
HS 7102.21 - Industrial: Unworked or simply sawn, cleaved or bruted, including bort and black diamonds for borers (the reference to sawn, cleaved or bruted has led to the interpretation that gem and near-gem-quality diamonds would be included).
HS 7102.31 - Non-industrial: Unworked or simply sawn, cleaved or bruted.
